The first car I owned was a 1969 Pontiac LeMans four door. It was kind of an ugly color on the outside. It had a nice interior and was a pleasure to drive. It took me through my last two years of college at the University of Wisconsin. It was the first big thing I owned. Since then, I have owned or co-owned quite a variety of cars and trucks, five motorcycles, five hunting rifles (I went through all five before I got a deer), a couple houses, a raft of musical instruments and recording equipment, and many smaller acquisitions too numerous to name. I am reminded that I live in a first world nation. All these things have had my name attached to them in some way - on a registration, or deed, or warranty, and so I owned them.

As Christians we are to have the understanding that we are not so much owners as stewards of our "possessions." God is the real Owner. Psalm 24:1 tells us that "the earth is the LORD'S and all it contains," so that makes Him the Proprietor. It is not easy to concede this point, especially when there is something of which we are especially fond. The term "mine" springs to our lips, and even very young children can say it with ardor and with an accompanying look which defies another child to think differently. If God should ask us to give up one of these things that are "mine" and we argue with Him, we discover we have drifted into idolatry, which causes us to be miserable if we are truly trying to live for Him. Note: the misery need not be permanent.

Even more difficult is the concept that we, and all people, belong to God. In Ezekiel 18:4 God says, "Behold, all souls are Mine..." 1 Corinthians 6: 19 adds, "do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit Who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own?" Perhaps if we apprehended this better, we would sin less.

We are acquired by God as "fixer uppers." There is no chip to replace as in a robot that can make us obedient to God. He chooses to work with our humanity and to let us choose to give

Him ownership of ourselves. Some of us require a good deal of fixing over a long period of time. All of us, at some juncture, encounter the term "surrender," and to our surprise it makes sense...finally, and there is peace...finally.

About the time we surrender, we also discern our "calling," our purpose for being on the earth...and life becomes more abundant, which Jesus said it would. We **accept being owned** and we are happy.

May you be happy in your surrender to Christ in the New Year.

Mokahum Ministry Center - Cass Lake, MN




